Allergic Contact Dermatitis to Aerosalised Vildagliptin

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Drug induced occupational allergic contact dermatitis is well known, but often under reported. Here, we present 2 cases of drug process technicians who developed facial dermatitis to aerosalised Vildagliptin, a Dipeptidyl-peptidase 4 inhibitor. Both patients had their diagnosis confirmed via patch test. There are currently no reports of allergic contact dermatitis to aerosalised Vildagliptin. This case report will also highlight the roles that individuals, physicians, companies and governments can play in the management and prevention of occupational related, air-bourne allergic contact dermatitis.
